That different techniques can be applied to a piece of Art to give different outcomes.

At the end of this topic, I will::

- To know about the artist Antony Gormley and identify some of his famous pieces of art.

- Use inspiration from famous, notable artists to create their own work and make comparisons.

Key vocabulary

Sculpture	Sculpture is a type of art. It must be three-dimensional (meaning that it must have height, width and depth like a cube).
Clay	A stiff, sticky fine-grained earth that can be moulded when wet, and is dried and baked to make bricks, pottery and ceramics.
Materials	A range of media including: rolled up paper, straws, card and clay to create your own sculpture.
Techniques	Different ways of creating your artwork.
Slip	Watered down clay. It is used as 'glue' to hold clay pieces together as it helps to prevent any cracking.
Antony Gormley	A British sculptor, who is famous for sculptures including 'The Angel of the North' and 'Another Place.'
