During the pre-admission meeting pupils and parents/carers are invited to visit school again and meet relevant staff. Relevant information is passed on at this point, from the parent/carer and other involved professionals to the school staff who use this information to ensure a smooth transition and maximize the pupils learning, health and wellbeing.

St Peter's School has an 'open door' policy and Parents and Carers are welcome to make an appointment if they wish to speak to someone in particular to ensure they are available to meet.

To support Parents/Carers in having a single point of contact in school, Mrs Farrelly, Mrs Beesley or Mrs Smith can coordinate liaisons with Parents/Carers of Pupils with additional needs. Parents and Carers are kept up to date with their child's progress via teacher discussions, Parents evening, School reports, Additional Support Plan and annual reviews, LAC and PEP meetings.

Annual school reports are sent out in July. These clearly show the Child's progress level to date, and share examples of wonderful learning experiences. Parents/Carers are invited to discuss the report via writing or a face to face meeting.

Termly newsletter – informing parents and carers what each class has been doing for that term and to celebrate achievements.

Special events that are held in school are well attended by Parents and Carers, such as Christmas Concerts, Year 6 Leavers celebration, individual class coffee mornings and workshops to name a few. These are sent to Parents via letter and are also promoted via the school website.

Parents and Carers are asked at regular points during the school year for their views/feedback in regards to matters such as communication between home/school, school meetings, events in school, reports/information on your Child, behaviour of the Children, and views of the school. This information is collected and collated then shared with all Parents Carers and Staff.
