Key Facts:

- The Government issued gas masks to everyone in Britain
- German submarines were attacking British ships creating a shortage of supplies. This led to rationing.
- Propaganda posters were used to encourage citizens to act safely and support the war effort
- Air raid shelters were built in gardens called Anderson Shelters. Shelters under stairs or in a house were called Morrison Shelters
- Children were taught drills on how to get to safety in case of an air raid. Many children were evacuated from cities to the countryside. Women worked in factories, as mechanics, air force, farms
